The [ICESA Campus Consortium](#) is pleased to announce its inaugural conference in September 2017. The conference planning committee is seeking proposals related to best practices and research about campus sexual violence prevention and response.

The conference is open to all campus professionals, researchers, graduate students, undergraduate students, and colleagues from non-campus agencies like hospitals, rape crisis centers, advocacy programs, and law enforcement. The purpose of this conference is to provide high-quality trainings and networking opportunities for professionals and students from a wide range of schools and communities.

We are seeking proposals that focus on innovative ideas, new research, or best practices about campus sexual assault prevention and response. In addition to session proposals from campus professionals and student leaders, we welcome proposals from researchers.

In particular, the committee is interested in session proposals that focus on the following topics:

- Athletes – Engaging student athletes and coaches in prevention efforts
- Bystander Intervention – Bystander trainings based on feminist theory, including a focus on rape culture
- Bystander Intervention – Bystander trainings for commuter or non-residential students
- Campus Climate Surveys – Strategies for obtaining high response rates, and/or use of climate survey data to inform prevention efforts
- Campus Sexual Assault Response Teams (SARTs)
- Cross-Campus Collaborations – Interdisciplinary, cross-campus efforts for sexual violence response and/or prevention
- Curriculum Infusion – Incorporating prevention or response efforts into classroom activities and syllabi
- Commuter Students – Engaging commuter or non-residential students in prevention efforts
- Employees – Strategies for educating employees about Title IX, response, and/or prevention
- Greek Life – Engaging fraternities in prevention efforts
- Institutionalization – Strategic planning and commitment from senior-level administrators to ensure long-term prevention and response efforts
- Online Students – Engaging online students in prevention or response efforts
- Police and Law Enforcement – Establishing positive student-police relationships through community policing or other innovative efforts

- Pornography – Impact of pornography on intimate relationships and students’ perceptions of sexuality and violence
- Pornography – Inclusion of critical media literacy in prevention efforts
- Prevention – Recent or ongoing research about effective prevention efforts
- Student Voices – please see our additional CfP for a student panel (this CfP will be released in late April and will have an extended deadline)

Submission Information:

Proposals should be submitted in a Word document, and include the following information:

- Presenter name(s), title(s), and institutional affiliation(s)
- Title
- Presentation description (300 words maximum)
- 3 learning objectives
- Presentation format (lecture; interactive workshop; panel)
- Note if this presentation has been conducted at any other conferences; if so, provide info about previously-conducted presentations
- Professional bios for each presenter (200 words maximum)
