CAPE (COMMUNITY AWARENESS, PREVENTION, AND EDUCATION) COMMITTEE 2019 OBJECTIVES

- Finalize and fill other CAPE **leadership positions**
- Develop a **process/protocol** for future TOTs and scheduling procedures for all current and future working groups
- Develop an **IPATH branded HT 101** training along with a process to certify trainers to conduct training in the community
- Create a committee to plan one **HT outreach event** in May in conjunction with the Indy 500
- Create and distribute **HT Awareness rest area signs/stickers** at Indiana rest areas
- Establish a **social media presence** (Facebook and Twitter) representing IPATH to raise HT awareness
- Facilitate a greater understanding of IPATH partner organizations' work and referral processes by having **agency spotlights** at CAPE meetings
- Facilitate a better understanding of the issues within and surrounding HT by implementing **facilitated discussions and topical trainings** for a minimum of 3 CAPE meetings.
- Develop and sign an **MOU** with CAPE member organizations

MEMBER EXPECTATIONS

The expectation of the CAPE Committee Chairs and Working Group Co-Chairs is that members will attend **4/6 meetings per year**, via conference call or in person. We meet for 2 hours, 6 times/year on the 1st Wednesday of even-numbered months from 1-3pm at ICESA.

In addition to meeting attendance, you will also be asked to contribute some additional time or expertise to 1 committee project or event of your choosing each year. Project-based participation is based on your capacity and time.

Options include:

CAPE:

- Event planning, coordination, and/or volunteering for CAPE events
- Content creation for social media, newsletters, and other projects
- Networking assistance to expand CAPE or CAPE WG's connections and reach throughout Indiana

Healthcare Working Group:

- Training of healthcare entities
- Provide resources for HT response protocol formation
- Technical assistance on healthcare trafficking cases

Youth Working Group:

- Training of Youth Curriculum
